I do certify that at the time of surveying the above described piece of land there appeared
 to be a quantity of s^d land cleared and fenced and a crop of Indian Corn growing thereon
 and also a Cabbin on s^d land fit for the habitation of man, but no family living in
 s^d Cabbin &c.

Note there was a family living in s^d Cabbin some short time before I surveyed it
 as Wm Woods has another farm joining s^d above described land and this being a
 small piece he rented both to one person and is drawing rent for the above piece
 of land and it is still in a state of Cultivation
