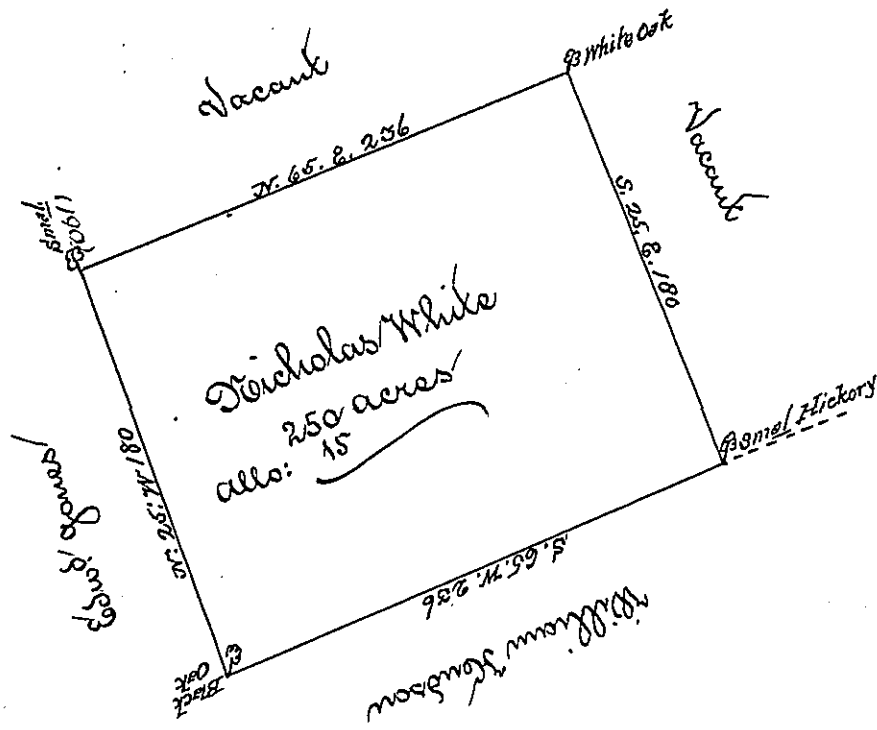

 By Virtue of a Warrant from the prop<sup>r</sup> Comm<sup>r</sup> & Survey<sup>r</sup>s to Nicholas White a certain  
 Tract of Land in the Township of Goshen in the County of Chester  
 Beginning at a Black Oak at a Corner of William Haddons Land thence North 25 degrees  
 Westerly by Land of W<sup>r</sup> Jones 180 perches to a Small Hickory thence North 65 degrees Easterly  
 by Vacant Land @ 236 perches to a White Oak thence South 25 degrees Easterly by Vacant  
 Land 180 perches to a Small Hickory thence South Sixty five Degrees Westerly by ye Land  
 of ye said William Haddon 236 perches to ye place of Beginning containing 250 acres with ye  
 allowance of six @ 15<sup>c</sup>
