



Pursuant to a warrant from ye propter Commis<sup>r</sup> Surveyed to Danl Worthington a certain tract of land in the Township of White Land in ye County of Chester March the 29<sup>th</sup> 1718

Beginning at a post in ye line of David Steeredeth thence south twenty four Degrees Easterly by ye land of ye sd David Steeredeth fifty perches to a black oak thence North sixty six Degrees Easterly by ye land Richd Anderson one hundred & seventy perches to a post thence North twenty four Degrees west by ye land of William Smith fifty perches to a post thence south sixty six Degrees west by other land of ye sd Danl Worthington one hundred & seventy perches to ye place of Beginning containing fifty acres with ye allowance of six P.C. — — →
