



Pursuant to a warrant from ye proprs^{rs} Comm^{rs} & surveyors to Daul Worthington a certain tract of land in the Township of White Land in ye County of Chester March the 29th 1718

Beginning at a post in ye line of David Harebell thence south twenty four Degrees Easterly by ye land of ye s^r David Harebell fifty perches to a Black Oak thence north sixty six Degrees Easterly by ye land Richd Anderson one Hundred & seventy perches to a post thence North twenty four Degrees west by ye land of William Smith fifty perches to a post thence south sixty six Degrees west by other land of ye s^r Daul Worthington one Hundred & seventy perches to ye place of Beginning containing fifty acres with ye allowance of six s^r c — — — — —
