Stagole thence north north west 62 perches to a Spanish oak thence west south west
122 perches to a poste thence south south east 200 perches to a ~~stone~~ pool thence
east north east in the line of George Head 425 perches to a Chestnut in the S^d line of
Concord thence north 24 degrees west in ye S^d line 213 perches to the first men-
tioned black oak containing 614 ac
