



Pursuant to the Proprietaries Warrant Dated the Tenth Day of October Anno. Dom 1740 And by the Surveyor Generals Direction I have Surveyed a Tract of Land in the Township of Coventry for Matthew Hopkins Beginning at a white Oak being a Corner of William Bransons Land thence North fifty five Degrees East one Hundred & Eighty Perches to a Black Oak thence North Twenty four Degrees West one Hundred Perches to a Chesnut tree thence North Eighty Degrees West by Vacant Land one Hundred and Twenty perches to a Chesnut tree thence South five Degrees west one Hundred and twenty four Perches to a Black Oak thence by the said ^{by John Bransons Land} thence South Eighty two Degrees west fifty four perches to a Hickory Sapling then South five Degrees west seventy six perches to a Chesnut Oak thence South Eighty five Degrees East Twenty four perches to a Post in the line of William Bransons Land thence by the same North Twenty eight Degrees East forty Perches to the Place of Beginning Containing 187. Acres with Allowance of six p Cent. Surveyed October y^e 28th 1740
