



Pursuant to the Proprietaries Warrant Dated the Ninth Day of October anno. Dom 1740 Ord by  
the Surveyor Generals Direction I have Surveyed a Tract of Land in the Township of Coventry  
for Matthew Hopkins. Beginning at a white Oak being a Corner of William Bransons Land  
thence North fifty five Degrees East one hundred & eighty Perches to a Black Oak thence North  
Twenty four Degrees West one hundred Perches to a Chestnut tree thence North eighty De-  
grees West by Vacant Land one hundred and Twenty perches to a Chestnut tree thence South  
fifty Degrees West one hundred and Twenty four Perches <sup>by John Slains Land</sup> to a Black Oak thence by the said Slains  
South Eighty two Degrees West fifty four perches to a Hickory Sapling then South five Degrees  
West Seventy six perches to a Chestnut Oak thence South Eighty five Degrees East Ninety four perch  
es to a Post in the line of William Bransons Land thence by the same North Twenty eight Degrees  
East forty Perches to the place of beginning containing 182. Acres with Allowance of six  
p/cent. Surveyed October 28<sup>th</sup> 1740
