



In Pursuance of an Application made the 26<sup>th</sup> Day of August 1765, by Frederick Spiegel, as well as an Order dated at the State house the 27<sup>th</sup> of July 1767, setting forth the Tracts relative to the Land in dispute between the said Spiegel and Obann Stobberly, I conveyed the above described Tract of Land, unto the said Frederick Spiegel, Beginning at a post, Thence North West fifty perches to a post set for a Corner in a line of Spiegles other Land. Thence by the same South West seventeen perches to another post set for a Corner in ~~the~~ the same line Thence South East fifty perches to a post, Thence North East seventeen perches to the place of Beginning, Containing Five Acres and the usual allowance of six acres ~~pr~~ for Roads &c, According to the Direction of John Braxler and Nicholas Freyer, W<sup>o</sup>: Shultz having by his Letter to me, given previous notice, that he could not possibly attend
