



A Draught of a Tract of Land situate in the Township of Springtown in the County of Chester, now in the Possession of David McCashe. Beginning at a marked Chestnut tree, and from thence extending by Daniel Henderson's Land South forty two perches to a marked Chestnut Oak, South thirty nine Degrees West eighty seven perches to a stone, and West one hundred and two perches to a stone, thence by James Scott's Land North thirty Degrees and a half East fifty perches to a marked white oak, North sixty one Degrees West seven p to a stone, and North twenty seven Degrees West sixty eight perches to a marked Maple tree, thence by Francis Alexander's Land North eighty nine Degrees and a half East one hundred and seventy four perches to the place of Beginning - Containing Sixty eight acres and the usual allowance of six acres p Cent for Roads &c.
