



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietaries dated the First day of June 1734 - Surveyed unto Thomas Jones a Tract of Land situate in New Britain in the County of Bucks Beginning at a Black Oak Sapling in ye line of Joseph Kirkbrides land thence by the same South West two hundred & ninety three perches to a post thence by land of Evan Thomas North West two hundred and four perches to a hickery a Corner of S<sup>r</sup> Evans land thence by ye same North East ninety eight perches to a post thence by land of W<sup>m</sup> Williams South East Twelve perches to a White Oak thence by ye S<sup>r</sup> Williams's North East thirty eight perches to a white Oak thence by ye same land South East twenty eight perches to a White Oak thence by ye same land North East forty nine perches to a post in ye line of Lewis Evans land thence by the same South forty Degrees East forty four perches to a Stone a Corner of S<sup>r</sup> Lewis Evans land thence by ye same North East one hundred and nine perches to a Corner of Owen Rowland's land thence by ye same South East one hundred and Twenty perches to ye place of Beginning. Containing Two hundred and Eighty four acres with the usual Allowance of Six per Cent
