



Situate on one of the head branches of Round Rich a branch of Juniata and on one of the head branches of Wolf Camp Run a branch of Mills Creek including a very old improvement, and laying on both sides of the Great Road leading from Somerset to Bedford and surveyed the 11<sup>th</sup> day of May 1792 by George Woods Esquire then Deputy Surveyor as appears by his Official Draught remaining in my office in pursuance of a warrant granted unto David Husband dated the 30<sup>th</sup> day of September 1784

Took the whole of this survey as originally made including the part between the dotted lines & contains 484<sup>a</sup> & allowance which H<sup>o</sup> Husband contends for his just right. By virtue of his old improvement and Office right the part of 57<sup>1/2</sup> between the dotted lines represent an interference that has happened by reason of inaccuracy in surveying the location rights in the name of J<sup>o</sup> Daily James H<sup>o</sup> Clure and others. the part adjoining James Daily between the dotted lines is patented lately I have heard to Casper Stabler who bought the right of Daily. H<sup>o</sup> Husband therefore contends for the part between the dotted lines, as it takes a considerable part of his old improvement and requests a hearing before the Honorable the Board of Property before Patent may issue for the 426<sup>1/2</sup> that is clear of dispute, as he thinks himself justly intitled to the whole 484<sup>a</sup> &
