


A Draught of a tract of Land called Crab-Tree Bottom situate on the South side of the West Branch of Susquehanna River about three miles below a remarkable semicircular groupe of young Walnuts growing on the North side of said River and about ten miles above Chingelemauche, adjoining and below Land surveyed for Humphrey Williams in Cumberland County. Containing Three hundred and Twenty seven acres and three Quarters and the usual allowance of Six Sp. Cent for Roads. &c. Surveyed 8th July 1769 for George Fust in pursuance of an order N<sup>o</sup> 3000. Dated 8th April 1769.
