



A Draught of a Tract of Land Called Sticky Hill (being part of a Tract called Spring Grove), Situate on the waters of Ketchenypawlings run about four miles North of that part of the Old Road leading from Bedford to Fort. Pitt where the same crosses the Beaver Dam Run, a adjoining South of Land of John Robinson in Brothere Valley Township in the County of Bedford Containing two hundred and eighty two acres and the usual Allowance of Six yd. Cent for Roads &c. Surveyed the 23^d day of Sept. 1770, for George Campbell in pursuance of an order No. 2904. Dated the 17th day of April 1769 by Thomas Smith D.S.
