



Pursuant to a Warr^t. from y^e pro^{vs} ^{es}. Co^{rris}. Dated the 15th of y^e 17th mo 1714. I survey to Ezekiel Harlan a certain Tract of Land in y^e Township of Kenneth in y^e County of Chester Beginning at a Corner marked Black Oak being a Corner of Isaac Taylor's Land thence North sixty one Degrees Westerly by Land of Joseph Taylor 50 perches to a post thence South West by Land of s^d Ezekiel Harlan 390 perches to a post Thence South East by a Line of marked Trees 228 perches to a Hickory Thence North East by Vacant Land 220 perches to a Hickory Thence North West by y^e Land of y^e said Isaac Taylor 180 perches to a post Thence North East by y^e same Land 184 perches to y^e place of Beginning Containing 346 acres wth y^e allowance of Dix p^t
