



These may Certify that Pursuant to a Warrant from the Proprietors Comiss<sup>r</sup> Dated the 16<sup>th</sup> of Feb<sup>r</sup> 1713 I surveyed to William Garritt one hundred acres of Land with the allowance of 6 acres as the Law directs situate in Willis Town in the County of Chester Beginning at a Corner Post being a Corner of the Indians Land thence North 24 deg<sup>r</sup> westerly by the Land of Tho: James 54 perches to a post thence South 66 Deg<sup>r</sup> Westerly by the Land of Samuel Davis and the Land of Tho: Garritt 211 perches to a black oak thence South 24 Degrees Easterly by Vacant Land 127 Perches to a black oak thence North 42 deg<sup>r</sup> Easterly by the Indians Land 231 Perches to the place of beginning
