



Pursuant to Order on the Application (No 3053) of William Starr, Dated January 14<sup>th</sup> 1768 Surveyed for the said W<sup>m</sup> Starr on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Day of the 2<sup>nd</sup> Month Next Ensuing the above Described Piece of Ground over which the Stream of Ridley Creek Passes, Situate between the Townships of Chester & Nether Providence in Chester County, and on which the said W<sup>m</sup> Starr hath Erected a Mill Dam, as follows Beginning at a Gum Tree Standing on obl. Southerly Bank of the said Ridley Creek about four Perches below his said Mill Dam, and thence Extending up the said Creek on the several Courses thereof by other Land of the said William Starr, the Lands of John Sharpless & Daniel Sharpless above One Hundred and forty three Perches to the uttermost Bounds of the Swell of the Water of the said Dam, thence Crossing the said Creek North 20° East about four Perches to the Northerly Bank thereof, thence Down the same on the several Courses thereof by the Land of the said Daniel Sharpless, and other Land of the said W<sup>m</sup> Starr about one Hundred and forty Perches to the Mouth of a small Run a few Perches below the said Dam, thence Crossing the said Creek South 37° East about three Perches & Eight Tenths of a Perch to the Place of Beginning containing three Acres of Ground with the usual allowance.
