



The shaded lines in the above diagram represent the Survey of John Stephenson made the 22<sup>nd</sup> of April 1773. on order of the 3<sup>rd</sup> April, 1769. No. 1659. The dotted lines in the above diagram represent the interfering Surveys of Stephen Porter and William Beatty the dates where of are inserted in the drafts respectively. It is said that Stephen Porter and William Beatty are Patented the title however has been settled in a court of justice in favor of John Stephenson ~~title~~ Survey and is now occupied and held under that title of John Stephenson. It is owned by John D. Alexander and Alexander W. Foster of Greensburgh in part and the heirs of John Pumroy in part occupied by Hugh Reed who is <sup>in</sup> possession of the part claimed by the heirs of Pumroy. Situate in Centre Township Indiana County. The above interference was ascertained the 18<sup>th</sup> December 1827. In pursuance of the several Acts of Assembly directing the recovery of the principal and interest due to the Commonwealth from persons holding lands by virtue of locations or other office titles issued from or under the Proprietary Government and by authority from the Board of Property.
