



In Pursuance of an Order of the Board of Property dated the 1<sup>st</sup> of August 1791, To me directed, and in compliance therewith I went to the Ground in dispute & Both parties appearing, I proceeded to survey, and found the lines, corners, & Quantity of Land as is above represented where this <sup>\*</sup> Mark is placed in the above plot is the spot that Nicholas Wireman & Henry Wireman pointed out to me upon each of their Affirmations, I ascertained the place (after being shewed where it was) by course and distance from my Beginning Gum, but as the Place where Proctor made his Improvement which was shewn by the said Wiremans and denoted by the star in the plot above is now cleared and in a Field we consequently could <sup>not</sup> see any of Proctors work there. Richard Proctors Warrant is dated the 1<sup>st</sup> day of April 1754. for 50 acres. Anthony Switzer's warrant for the same Land is dated the 29<sup>th</sup> day of June 1772, I could not procure any Draught when I made the above survey, but went partly by the adjoining Draught, and by the Information of Switzer. Resurveyed by the Old Lines the 14<sup>th</sup> August 1791.
