In Pursuance of a Warrant bearing Date the 22nd. Day of November anno Dom. 1736 surveyed unto Adam Shawde a Certain Tract of Land situated on Grand Spring Creek in the County of Lancaster Beginning at a White Oak Tree marked for a Corner of his and Jacobo Senesback's Land, Thence extending by Vacant Land the Town Courses and Distances next following vizt one hundred and ninety seven Yards to a white Oak, South Forty Yards to a white Oak, South 67 Deg: East one hundred and forty six Yards to a white Oak and South 3 1/2 Deg: East one hundred and forty Yards to a white oak Thence by John Loyall's Lands North 69 Deg: East one hundred and sixty eight Yards to a Hickory Thence by vacant land North 21 Deg: East one hundred and thirty four Yards to a black Oak Thence by Vacant Land and Lands of Jacob Senesback North 47 Deg: West seventy four Yards to the Place of Beginning containing Two hundred and Eleven Acres and Fifty one Yards Beside the usual allowance of 6 1/2 for Roads &c Surveyed the 18th Day of July A.D. 1737

Adam Shawde has divided this Tract into two parts one of which he sold to Thomas Rees who paying the Consideration money due for the same to James Head & Rawling A Shawde's Deed a Recount was made into the Secretary's Office of March 1738 fees paid
