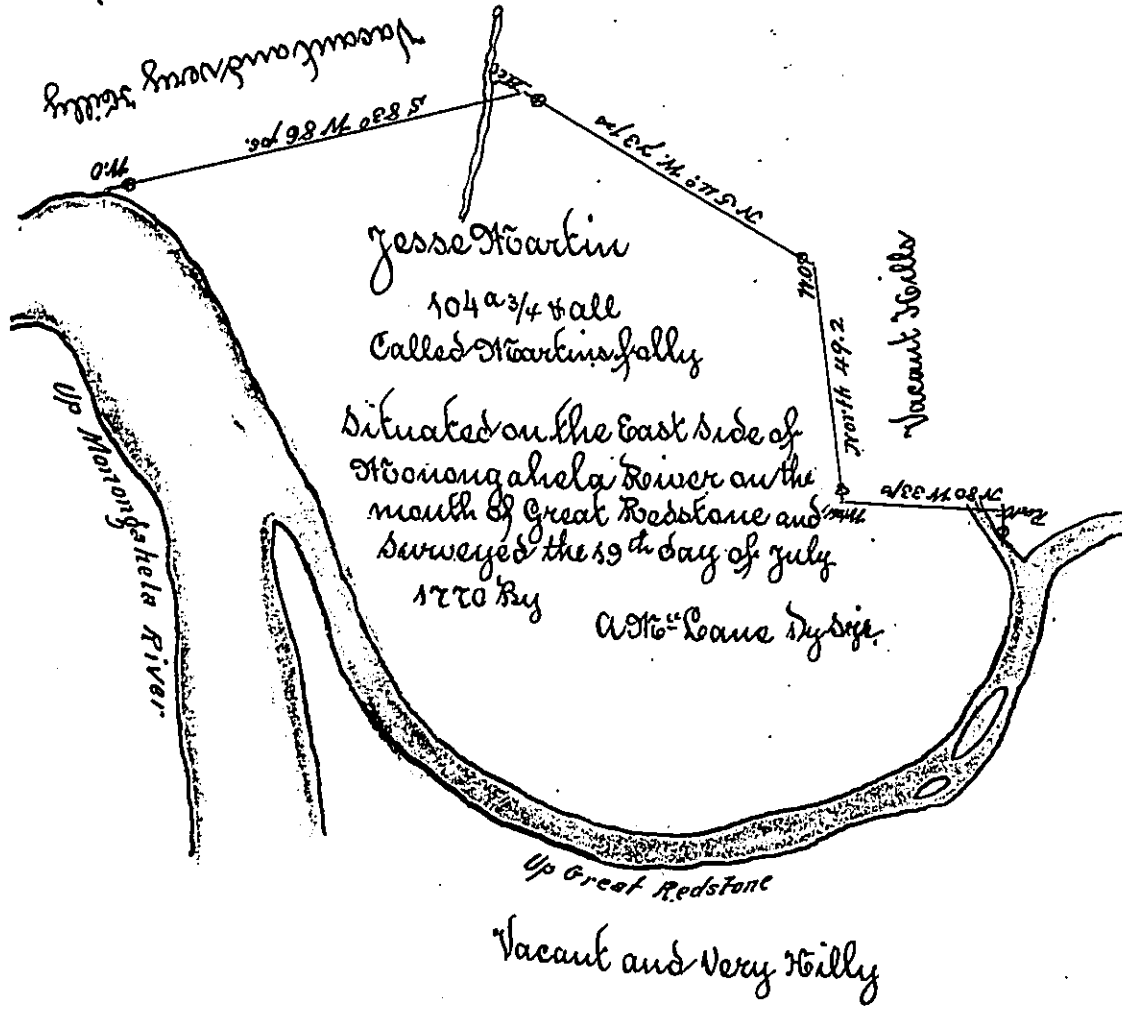

The Ohio Company formerly had this place in possession and built some storehouses upon it and a certain William Jacobs has since their ^{for sometime} departure possessed and claimed it and at the time the office was open obtained an order of survey for it No 3156 dated the 24th day of April 1769 and sold his right to a certain Prior Theobald who agreed with the said Jesse Martin (who has been in possession of the land since the year 1766) that it should be surveyed to said Martin he performing certain conditions, which conditions are not yet performed; no patent to be granted until said Martin produces a certificate that the above agreement is fulfilled
