



Situate on the South side of the West Branch of Susquehanna River, about one mile and a half South West of a Deer Tick on the Branch, known by the name of Sandy-Tick in Allegheny Township Huntington County, containing four hundred and twenty six Acres, ten Perches and the Usual Allowance for Roads - Surveyed the 4th Day of September 1800 for William Drinker in pursuance of his Warrant dated the 10th day of January 1800. -
