



Sixty-four acres of Stony Creek in the Township of Lower Mifflin
Now Somerset County and Surveyed the 19th day of October
1796 by George Woods Esq. of Philadelphia. as appears by his official
Surveyor's Commission Office in pursuance of a warrant
Granted to Peter Dishong for 300a dated the 5th day of
August 1796. And Certified the 8th day of January 1805
To Samuel Cochran Esquire

Surveyor General - John CLean Deputy.
Nothing is wholly disputed by George Woods
Surveyor on his warrant for 200a dated the 15th day of Aug-
ust 1793 and Phillip R. Crooke's Warrant for 200a dated 15th Aug-
ust 1798 and perhaps others, as it was not permitted to
trace the lines & cannot describe the differences
with other surveys & went at the request of Mr. Wood-
ward to Retrace the lines if he could find a draught of the
same which he found in the Commissioners Office and
after a useless search on the ground found the Hickory
Corner & then had the Chain stretched over to start and two
men then belonging to the parties seized the Chain and had to
quit &c. - S.C.S.S.
