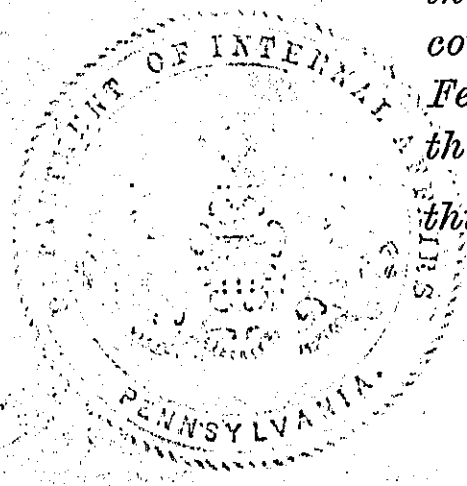


By Virtue of a Warrant from the Hon<sup>ble</sup> Proprietaries bearing  
 Date the Tenth of February Anno Dom<sup>o</sup> 1737  
 I have Survey'd and Laid out unto Sam<sup>l</sup> Harris in the Township of  
 Hopewell in the County of Lancaster on the West Side Susquehanna  
 river One hundred and Seventy Seven acres with allowance of sixpence  
 Beginning at a Hickery Standing by Conecochege Creek thence South  
 fifty four Degrees Easterly - (06 5) - perches to a White Oak South thirty six  
 Degrees Westerly Seventy four perches to a White Oak thence South Seven  
 teen Degrees Westerly one Hundred and forty seven perches to a White  
 Oak thence West nineteen perches to a Ash Standing by the said Creek then  
 up the same Traversing the Several Courses thereof near about three  
 Hundred and ninety perches to the place of Beginning  
 Survey'd May 24<sup>th</sup> 1739 p<sup>ro</sup> me Zach Butcher D<sup>pt</sup>  
 To Benja Eastburn Survey<sup>r</sup> Gen<sup>l</sup>

 conformably to an Act of Assembly approved the 16th day of
