



By Virtue of a warrant from the Proprietaries dated the thirteenth day of October 1734. Surveyed unto Henry Ent a tract of Land situate in Old Cowiswopen, in the County of Philad.^a Beginning at a Black Oak a corner of Ludwick Scheffers land thence by the same North East eighty one perches to a Stone thence by Vert Land South East two hundred & thirty perches to a post, thence by land of Andreas Hawk South West one hundred and ninety one perches to a post, thence by land of Peter Keiter North west twenty six perches and by Land of Ludwick Scheffer the same course one hundred and fourteen perches to a Black Oak thence by s^r. Scheffer North East one hundred and ten perches to a post, thence by s^r. Scheffer North West ninety perches to y^e place of Beginning Containing Two hundred acres with the usual allowance of six y^e Cent. Surveyed 9. 2. 1734 By
