I have surveyed and laid out unto John Forsyth in the Township of Hopewell in the County of Lancaster: On the West side Susquehanna River Three hundred and forty two Acres of Land with allowance of 6^d. Cent Beginning at a post standing in the Line of Charles Magill's Land then by the said Land and other Vacant North Thirty seven Degrees Easterly Two hundred and forty two perches to a Black-oak thence South Thirty five Degrees Easterly Two hundred and forty perches to a Black-oak thence South Thirty seven Degrees Westerly Two hundred and forty perches to a white-oak thence North ~~44~~ fifty three Degrees Westerly Two hundred and forty perches to the place of Beginning Surveyed
