



Surveyed to David Johnston on the 22<sup>nd</sup> day of October 1813 the above described tract of land (or part of a larger tract) containing one hundred and fifty <sup>three</sup> acres and sixty perches with an allowance of six per Cent &c. By virtue of a warrant dated September 30<sup>th</sup> 1813. Situate N.E. of the Allegany river on the headwaters of Long run which empties into Buffalo Creek & adjoins lands settled by Philip Sempleton on the North Reichal's Kid on the East Wm Cowan on the South and the residue of said tract on the West in Sugar Creek Township Armstrong County
