



Pursuant to a warrant under the hand of Thomas Penn Esq. & ye. lesser seal Dated the tenth day of March AD. 1739* and the Request of the Surveyor General

I surveyed unto Daniel Harris a Tract of Land in Coventry in Chester County. Beginning at a Corner heap of Stones in the line of David Stephens' Land thence North Sixty Five Degrees East One Hundred and Ten Perches to a white Oak thence North East by the same Land One Hundred and Eight Perches to a Post in the Line of Thomas Willard's Land thence by the same Land South East one Hundred and Sixty Perches to a corner Black Oak thence South Fifty Five Degrees West one Hundred and Sixty Perches to a ^{Corner} Black Oak thence North West Thirty Five Perches to a Black Oak thence South Fifty Five Degrees West Fifty Six Perches to a Black Oak sapling thence North West One Hundred and Twenty Six Perches to the place of Beginning. Containing One Hundred and Seventy Acres and Three quarters with Allowance of Six p Cent
