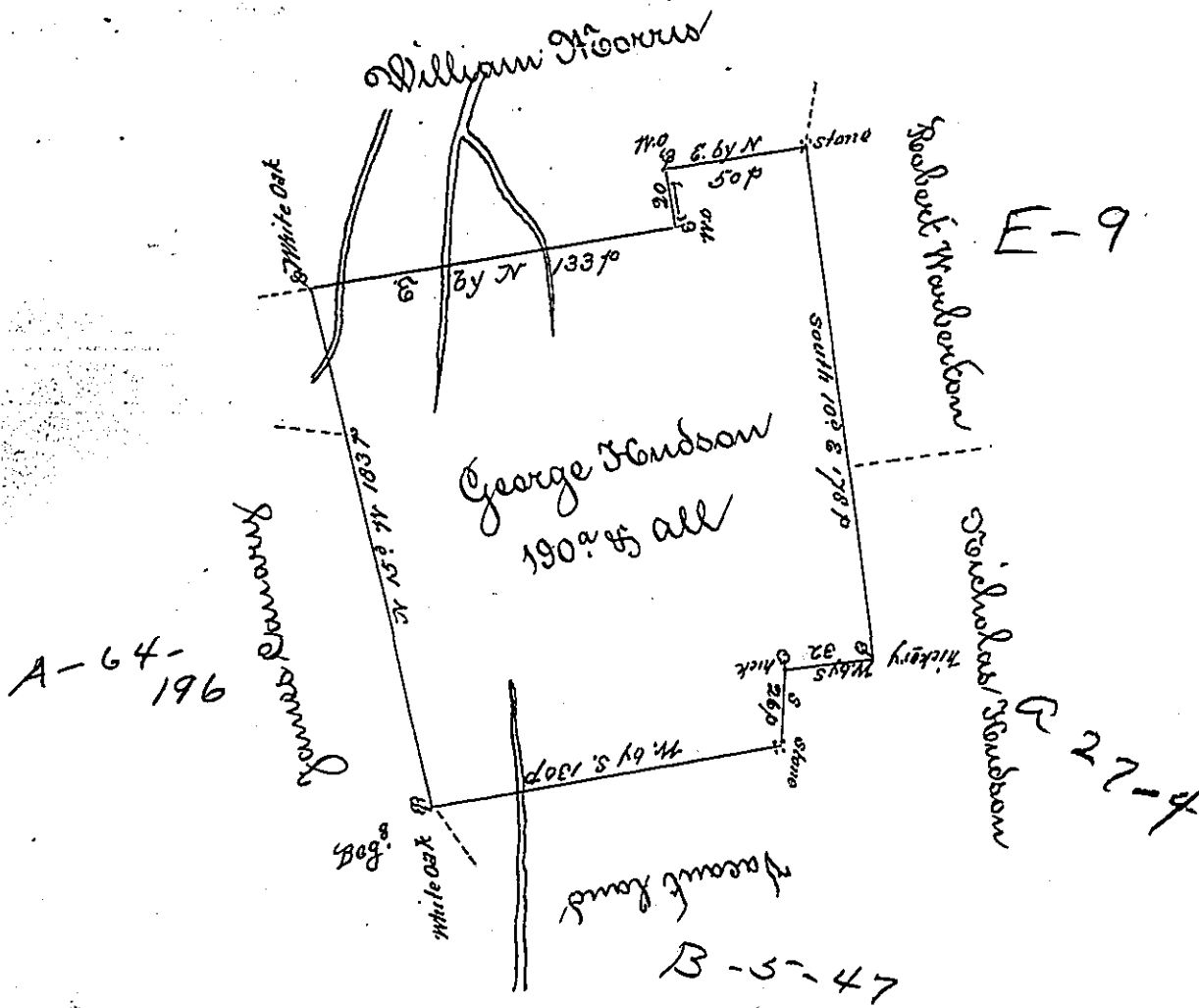

By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietor Dated the 24<sup>th</sup> Day of August Anno Dom 1737 the above Described Tract of Land was surveyed unto George Hodson in Tere Township in Lancaster County Beginning at a Stone thence West by South by Vacant Land 130 perches to a White Oak thence North 15 Degrees West by y<sup>e</sup> Land of James Canary & Vacant Land 183 perches to a White Oak thence East by North by y<sup>e</sup> Land of William Hoovers 133 perches to a White Oak then North by West by the same 20 p<sup>er</sup>ches to a White Oak thence East by North by the same 50 p<sup>er</sup>ches to a Stone thence South 10 Degrees East by the Land of Robert Warburton and Nicholas Hodson 128 perches to a Wichery thence West by South by the said Hodson 32 perches to a Wichery thence South by the same 26 perches to y<sup>e</sup> place of Beginning Containing One hundred and Ninety acres beside the allowance of six p<sup>er</sup>cent
