



The above Draught describes two pieces of land which were surveyed for John McKeeloy (or Mr. Troy, adjoining his former survey) on the 7th & 8th Day of the 5th mo 1766. In Pursuance of _____ Note There was a Dispute & hearing before the Governor between the sd. Mr. Troy & his Neighbour Nathl. Clark, in the fore part of the Year 1766 (I suppose) upon which, a Particular order came directed to me (without Date) to Survey the Land & describe the Situation &c^a in a Return; upon which I went thither; but the Dispute was by that Time settled between the Parties. & so the above was surveyed for Mr. Troy as aforesaid
