



A Draught of a Tract of Land Situate in Martic Township in the County of Lancaster containing two hundred and thirty Acres, and the Allowance of Six Acres & Cent for Roads and Highways, Surveyed the 15<sup>th</sup> April 1751 for Andrew McCleery in pursuance of a Warrant bearing date the 7<sup>th</sup> of March 1749/50. Protracted from the field Book of Thomas Cookson Esq<sup>r</sup> late Deputy Surveyor of Lancaster County and calculated.

A Caveat was entered by W<sup>m</sup> Beman against Return of the above Survey, the Parties were obliterated the 14<sup>th</sup> of Feb<sup>r</sup> 1760 before Richard Peters Esq<sup>r</sup> Secretary &c. who dismissed the Caveat, and ordered the Draught to be Returned
