



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietor. Dated the 28<sup>th</sup> of Sept: 1737  
 the above described Tract of Land was surveyed unto Matthias Webber in the  
 Township of Tulpehocken in the County of Lancaster. Beginning at a small  
 Hickory at a corner of the Land of Casper Wister. Thence North 40 deg.  
 West by Vacant land 104 perches to a Stone. Thence South 50 deg.  
 West by Vacant land 163 perches to a Black Oak. Thence South 40 deg.  
 East by V<sup>a</sup> Land 104 perches to a Post. Thence North 50 deg.  
 East by y<sup>e</sup> Casper's Land 163 perches to y<sup>e</sup> place of Beginning Contain-  
 ing One Hundred acres beside y<sup>e</sup> usual allowance
