In pursuance and by virtue of an Act of the General Assembly, ^{of the 29 January 1791} entitled an Act granting Eight hundred Dollars to Cornplanter, Half Town and Big Tree Seneca Chiefs in Trust for the Seneca nation and for other purposes therein mentioned and Instructions from the Governor & Surveyor General. I have surveyed to Cornplanter July 10th 1795. the above described Island situated in the Horegheny River nearly opposite to an Indian Town called Junishadago. Containing fifty three acres sixty seven perches & allowed of six p Cent &c
