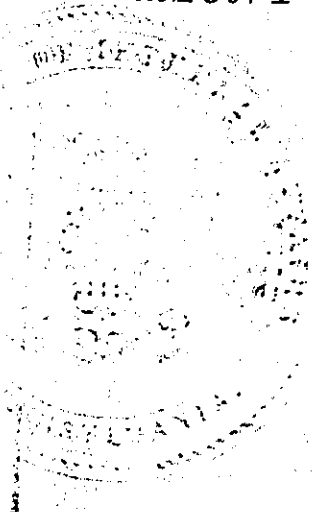


In pursuance and by Virtue of an Act of the General Assembly ^{of the 29th January 1791} entitled An Act for granting Eight Hundred Dollars to Cornplanter, Half Town and Big Tree, Seneca Chiefs, in Trust for the Seneca Nation, and for purposes therein mentioned and directions from the Govern^{or} and Surveyor General, I have Survey'd July 12, 1795 to Cornplanter the above described Tract of Land situated on the West side of the Allegheny River and about three miles below the Northern boundary of this State, including an Indian Town called Jumashadago, containing six Hundred Sixty acres ^{45 perches} & allowance of six per Cent for Roads &c.
