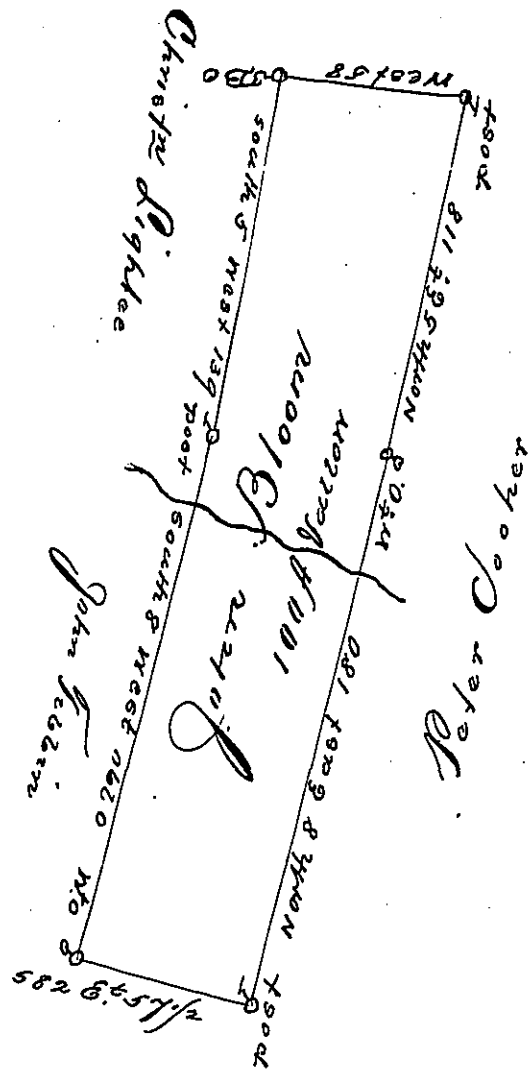

By Virtue of a Warrant from the Honorable Proprietaries bearing date the 19th Day of December Anno Dom 1737, Surveyed to John Bloom a Tract of Land in Lebanon Township, Beginning at a post thence North 8 Deg East 180 per to a White Oak, thence North 5 Deg East 118 per to a post, thence West 58 per to a Black Oak, thence South 5 Deg West 139 per to a post, thence South 8 Deg West 150 per to a White Oak, thence South 82 Deg East 57 per $\frac{1}{2}$ to the place of Beginning. Containing One hundred acres of Land & the usual allowance of six acres p. Cent for Roads &c. Surveyed the second day of March Anno Dom 1738/9
