

By Virtue of a Narvant from the Proprietaries dated the thirtieth day of October 1734 Surveyed unto Milliam Mirte a tract of Band Situate in Old Boursschoppin in the Country of Philada. Beginning at a White Oak aborner of Gabriel Shoolair land standing on the East Bank of Perkionic breek thence by sh. Shoolair land Shoolair land Morth East thirty perchects a white oak thence by ed. Shoolair land North East Twenty Six perchects a white oak thence by ed. Shoolair land North East Twenty Six perchects a poet aborner of Villiam Smithsland thence by the same South East one humbered and nine perchect sa poet aborner of Jeorge Cowkillsland thence by the same South Mest Swenty two perchects an Alder Gree standing on the Bank of sd. Screek thence up the earne to the place of Beginning Containing Seventy two acres with the usual allovance of Six pleent.
