



By order of the Proprietary Surveyed the first day of March Anno Dom 1765 to John Allison a Tract of Land Situate in the Township of Donegal in the County of Lancaster Beginning at a Hickory in the line of Robert Allison's land thence North 30 deg West 187 perches to a Black Oak thence North Seventy seven deg East eleven perches to a Hickory thence North 35 deg West 33 perches to a post thence South Seventy deg West thirteen perches to a post thence North 26 deg West 32 perches to a post thence North thirty four deg East five perches to a post thence North 56 deg West 68 perches to a White Oak thence South 33 deg ^{3/4} West 39 perches to a white oak thence South 25 degrees West 117 perches to a Black Oak thence South 39 deg West 80 perches to a Black Oak thence ^{South} 62 deg East 267 perches to a Black Oak thence North 45 deg East 95 perches to the place of Beginning containing Two Hundred & ninety acres and the allowance of Six acres p cent for Roads & highways
