



Situate in Drummore Township Lancaster County was Granted to Isaac Alexander by Warrant Dated the 13th of December 1750. This Land was Survey'd formerly with other Land for Henry Bradley (by my Father) & the Right thereof by him Transferr'd to his Son in Law Isaac Alexander, it was Survey'd long before the above named Wm. Mitchel was the owner of that Maryland Tract adjoining & the former Possessors thereof who sold the same to Mitchel acknowledged the above Described to be Henry Bradley's property who frequently made use of the Timbers as also did Isaac Alexander without Interruption, till within these few years, the above relation I believe to be true, as I had it from those who well knew the whole case; I was on the Premises the 9th day of ye 3rd mo. N. D. 1752, viewing the same but did not run any lines, only from Mitchel's beginning Tree part of his first course from wch Time this Survey may be Dated, if thought proper to be accepted.
