



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietor Dated the 29th day of March Anno Dom. 1735 A Tract of Land was Surveyed unto William Allen in Hanover (formerly a part of Derry) Township in Lancaster County. Beginning at a White Oak Thence South 78 Degrees West by the Improvement of William Baird (64) perches to a post by Manaday Creek Then down the same 56 p. to a Beech thence South 50 degrees west by the Improvement of James Riddle 20 perches to a White Oak Thence North 78 degrees West by the same 100 perches to a White Oak Then South 12 degrees East by ye same & Samuel Ferguson 32 perches to a post by the sd. creek then down the same on the several Courses thereof to a White Oak Thence by the said Samuel Ferguson the five Courses following (viz) North 65° East 9 perches to a White Oak East 16 perches to a White Oak South 50 degrees East 21 perches to a Dead tree South 79 Degrees East 25 perches to a White Oak & South 12 Degrees East 14 perches to a post Thence North 78 Degrees East 112 perches by the Improvement of John Mc Curry to a post Thence North 12 Degrees West by William Erwin and William Baird 22.5 perches to the place of Beginning Containing One Hundred and Ninety four acres beside the allowance of Six pcent. p.
