



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Honble Proprietaries Bearing Date the 19<sup>th</sup> Day of December Anno. Dom. 1737 Surveyed to Peter Cooker a Tract of Land in The Township of Lebanon Beginning at a Black Oak thence North 99 per to a post thence West 4 per to a post thence North 11 Deg East 20 per to a post thence North 56 per to a post thence North 23 Deg &  $\frac{1}{2}$  East 169 per to a Spanish oak thence South 76 Deg West 125 per to a Black Oak thence South 40 Deg West 66 per to a Black Oak thence South 5 Deg West 133 per to a white oak thence South 5 Deg West 140 per to a hickory thence North 50 Deg East 132 perches to the place of Beginning Containing Two Hundred Twenty-four acres of Land with the usual Allowance of six Acres per Cent for Roads &c Surveyed February the 25<sup>th</sup> Anno. Dom. 1758/9.
