



At Settlement Sale of William Clark Decd.

By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietor dated the 21st. Day of December Anno Dom. 1733 The above described Tract of land was surveyed unto John Craighhead in Right of Thomas Craighhead Deceased in the Township of Salisbury in the County of Lancaster Beginning at a Hickey Fence north by Andrew Campbell 96 perches to a white oak, Thence East by John Campbell 84 perches to a black oak Thence South East by the same 48 perches to a small run then Down the Same 14 perches to the line of the said Craighhead Thence west along the Same 80 perches to a white oak Thence South by ye sd. Craighhead first survey 51 perches to a B. Oak Thence west by the Settlement Sale of William Clark Decd. 36 perches to ye place of Beginning Containing Forty acres beside the usual allowance. 14th. of 6 mo. 1739.
