

Pennsylvania fs.

Whereas by Consent of the Proprietaries there was some time since surveyed unto Robert Crumleton a Tract of Land Situate on the West side of Susquahanna River in the County of Lancaster in that part thereof since called the Township of Antrim Now in Pursuance of a Warrant from the sd. Proprietaries dated the 11th day of August 1741 requiring me to accept & receive the said Survey into my office and to make a Return thereof into the Secretary's office in order for Confirmation I do hereby certify that the metes & bounds of the same are as follow That is to say Beginning at a corner marked Hickerij tree & extending thence by vacant land South sixty degrees East one hundred & eighty perches to a post & South thirty degrees West sixty perches to a black oak & South sixty degrees East fifty perches to a black oak and South thirty degrees West three hundred & forty perches to a post and North sixty degrees West two hundred & thirty perches to a post and North thirty degrees East four hundred perches to the place of beginning containing five hundred twenty four acres & three quarters of an acre and the allowance of six acres p. cent for Roads &c. Returned into the Secretary's office the 11th day of August 1741
