



By virtue of a Warrant from the Honorable Proprietaries bearing Date the _____ Day of _____ Anno Dom 1733 I have Surveyd and Laid out unto Joseph Crundleton in the Township of Hopewell in the County of Lancaster on the west side Susquehanna River four hundred and sixty nine acres of land with allowance of epherit Beginning at a white oak Thence South forty degrees Easterly 700 hundred and Twenty pches to a Kicker Thence south fifty degrees Westerly Three hundred and sixty two pches to a post Thence north forty degrees westerly Two hundred and twenty pches to a Swamp aka corner of Jacob Snibily's Land Thence north fifty Degrees easterly Three hundred and Sixty two pches to the place of Beginning. Settled in June 1735 by witnesses of the year 1734. Surveyd Novr. 1739 p.me: Zach. Butcher Dpt.

By Warrant of the 11th. of Augt. 1741 to accept this survey &c. Returned into the Secretary's office the same day.
