The above is a draught of a tract of land called Tractuous, situate on the west side of Monongahela River in Washington County containing three hundred and ninety nine acres one hundred and fifty seven perches strict measure, which said tract (by the papers and documents in my possession) appears to have been surveyed the 19th day of February 1797, in pursuance of a Virginia Certificate granted to Edward Dorsey Assignee of David Rogers for four hundred acres, to include his settlement made in the year one thousand seven hundred and seventy two, dated at Redstone old fort the first day of November in the fourth year of the Commonwealth, and was entered with Gabl. Madison Deputy Surveyor of Monongahela County the 25th day of December 1779, as appears by endorsement thereon. Resurveyed the 5th day of May 1823
