



In Pursuance of a Warrant from the Prop^r dated the 28th day of March Anno Dom. 1735, Surveyed unto Jacob Taylor on the 3d. day of June then next ensuing a Tract of Land situate on a branch of Doe run in Marlborough Township in the County of Chester. Beginning at a Black Oak at a corner of John Taylor's land thence south by the same sixty perches to a Hickery thence west by the land of Joseph Baker and Robert Burns 84 pches to a Black Oak thence north five degrees west by the land of the Robert Burns and the land of Thomas Cox 120 pches to a Chestnut tree thence north 24° east by the sd. Cox's land 49 pches to a ^{post} ~~post~~ north north west by the same land 70 pches to a Hickery thence north east by east by the land of the sd. Thomas Cox thirty pches to a ~~post~~ white oak thence south east by the land of Joseph Baker and the sd. John Taylor 200 pches to the place of Beginning containing Eighty four acres and the usual allowance for Roads.
