 Second day of Septem<sup>r</sup> 1734 Surveyed unto George Underner  
 a tract of Land situate in New Cowissitoppin in ye County  
 of Philad<sup>a</sup> Beginning at a White Oak a Corner of Philip  
 Lebars land Standing in ye line of ye German tract thence  
 by Vacant land South East two hundred and fifty four per-  
 ches to a post thence by Vacant Land South West one hun-  
 dred perches to a post thence by Vacant Land North West  
 Seventy five perches and by land of Jacob Smith ye same  
 Course one hundred & eighty perches to a post in ye line  
 of sd<sup>d</sup> German Tract thence by ye same North East one  
 hundred perches to ye place of Beginning Containing one  
 hundred and fifty acres with ye usual allowance of six<sup>p</sup> Cent  
 Surveyed Nov: 1<sup>st</sup> 1734 Nich<sup>o</sup> Scull
