



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietaries dated the third day of January 1733 Surveyed to Evan Griffith a tract of Land situated in Hilton Township in the County of Bucks Beginning at a Black Oak standing in the County line thence by the Servants Township North East one hundred and eighty one perches to a post in the line of Logans land thence by the same South East Ninety four perches to a Spanish Oak thence South West one hundred and eighty one perches to a post <sup>in</sup> the line dividing the County of Philad<sup>a</sup> & Bucks thence along the same Northwest Ninety four perches to y<sup>e</sup> place of Beginning Containing one hundred and six Acres with the usual Allowance of six p Cent Surveyed April y<sup>e</sup> 5<sup>th</sup> 1734

By Nich<sup>o</sup> Scull Contains 100<sup>as</sup> besides the Allowance of 6<sup>as</sup> for Roads &c Returned into the Secretarys Office the 24<sup>th</sup> of y<sup>e</sup> 3<sup>d</sup> mo 1734
