



Pursuant to a Warrant Under the hands of John Penn and Thomas Penn Esq^{rs} Proprietaries of the Province of Pennsylvania Dated the 8th Day of February A.D. 1734 and the lesser Seal of the s^d Proprietaries for Surveying unto John Dongela Tract of Land in Coventry Township Adjoining or near to Samuel Nutt and Thomas Millers Land in Chester County Surveyed unto William Adams Assignee of the said Dongel the following Tract of Land. Beginning at a corner marked Chestnut Tree in the line of John Plain's Land Thence North seventy four Degrees West one Hundred & sixty Perches ^{by vacant Land} to a Spanish Oak mark Thence North by Concord Lices Improvement One Hundred and Forty Perches to a corner black oak Thence East by Vacant Land One Hundred Eighty six Perches to a corner Black Oak Thence South Five Degrees West One Hundred and seventy Perches to a corner Chestnut Oak Thence by s^d Plain's Land South Eighty Degrees West Ninety Perches to a corner Hickery tree Thence South Ten Degrees East Thirteen Perches to the Place of Beginning. Containing One Hundred and Sixty Four acres with allowance of six p Cent Surveyed y^e 4th Day of 7th Anno Dom. 1740
