



By virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietaries dated the Eleventh day of June 1734. Surveied into Alexander Dippenderwer a tract of land situate in Townshipsupper in the County of Bucks Beginning at a post a Corner of George Melver's land thence by land of George Shoemaker South sixteen perches to a post thence by land of Jacob Button South East fifty two perches to a hickery Sapling thence by s<sup>r</sup>. Button's land South Eighty two degrees East thirty six perches to a Black Oak Sapling thence by s<sup>r</sup>. Button's land South East Eighty four perches and by Vacant land the same Course fifty two perches to a Black Oak Sapling thence by Vacant land North East one hundred & sixty perches to a Black Oak Sapling thence by Vacant land North West one hundred & twenty two perches to a <sup>hickery</sup> post thence by Vacant land South west sixty four perches to a post a Corner of s<sup>r</sup>. George Melgar's land thence by the same West one hundred & fifty perches to the place of Beginning Containing one hundred & fifty acres with the usual allowance of six & out Surveied Decem<sup>r</sup>. 20<sup>th</sup> 1754 By Rich<sup>d</sup>. Scull.
