



By virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietor Dated ~~Feb~~ the Eighth Day of March Anno Dom 1734 - The above Described Tract of Land was Surveyed unto John Jones in the Township of Curru (formerly a part of Robeson Township) in the County of Lancaster Beginning at a Hickery & a Corner of other land of the said Jones Thence North 30 Degrees West by Vacant Land 105 perches to a Black Oak Thence South 60 Degrees West by Vacant Land 128 perches to a Hickery Thence North 30 Degrees West by y^e same 20 perches to a White Oak Thence South 60 Degrees West by Vacant Land 92 perches to a white Oak Thence South 30 Degrees East by the same to the Land of Thomas Nicholas 125 perches to a White Oak Thence North 60 Degrees East by the other Land of the said John Jones 220 perches to y^e place of Beginning Containing One Hundred & Forty seven acres beside y^e Allowance of Six p Cent.
