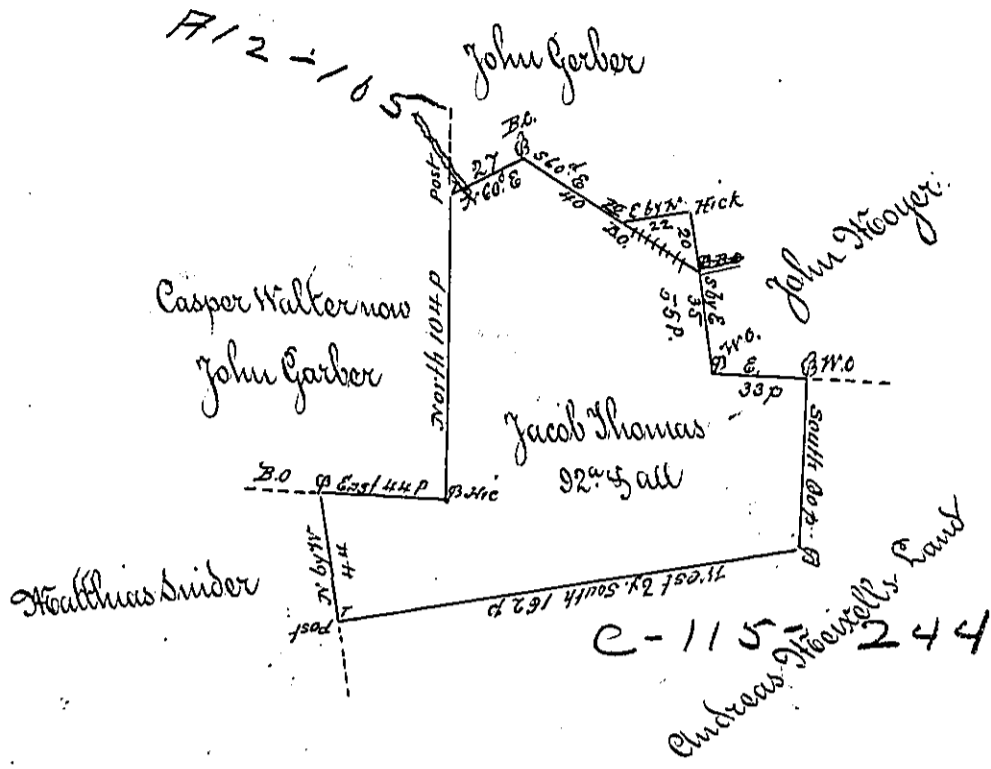


The small Triangular piece taken out of John Gerber's Land to be added to this



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietor Dated the 19<sup>th</sup> day of May Anno Dom 1758  
 The Above Described Tract of Land was surveyed unto Jacob Thomas in Hancock Town-  
 ship in Lancaster County Beginning at a post thence North 60 Degrees East by the  
 Improvement of Casper Walter 27 perches to a Black Oak thence South 60 Degrees  
 East by the same ~~70 perches to a Black Oak~~ <sup>40 p to a B.O.</sup> thence E by N ~~22 p to a Hickory~~ <sup>22 p to a Hickory</sup> thence South by East by John Hooyer ~~55~~ <sup>55</sup>
